HEADTEACHER'S NEWS

This week the Community Group have launched their campaign to reduce the use of plastic in our school. We are focusing on Breakfast Club, snacks and drinks that pupils bring into school and packed lunch. There is a total ban on the use of straws, plastic carrier bags and plastic bottles in the school. Members of the group talked to the pupils about the different measures that they can take to avoid using such plastics. I am delighted to see that the majority of pupils are bringing in reusable water bottles, packed lunches in the correct packed lunch boxes and using containers instead of plastic bags to store both their snack and lunch. We have been continuing our phonic assessments and I have been really impressed with the children's knowledge, thank you for all your support with using the sound and word detective books at home. In maths the reception children have been focusing on 'taking away'. We have used lots of practical resources (including the children themselves) to understand the concept of taking away and some children have had a try at writing their own number sentences. All the children have also been very busy creating their personalised cards ready for a very special day on Sunday!

Next week - our class assembly for the reception children is on Wednesday at 9 o'clock, I hope you can manage to make it. It is also science week at St John's school next week which is going to be really exciting; we have some great 'WOW' experiments planned for our newly designed Ruby science lab! SAPPHIRE CLASS

I am really impressed with how the children have conducted themselves this week in terms of their behaviour and attitudes despite last week's snow disruption! Well done everybody. I was particularly impressed with the enthusiasm and excitement of the children during World Book Day. All costumes were fantastic and we all had a very enjoyable day! Before I discuss what we have done this week, can I first of say a big thank you to those parents who were able to attend our Ocean Maths Workshop on Tuesday. I hope you found it useful and beneficial for helping your child(ren) with their maths work at home. If you were unable to attend, or have any additional questions/queries about what was shared on Tuesday, please feel free to come and see me. Over the weekend, please talk to your child about the importance of washing their hands and other basic hygiene things in order to ensure the spread of infections and unwanted illnesses to a minimum. If you have purchased a CPG book (Year 1 and 2), I strongly recommend that your child undertakes practise in an area they feel they need more practice on. Again, if there are any questions/queries regarding these books, including approaches to help your child with their practice, I am more than happy for you to come and see me. This week in Literacy, we continued our diary from the point of view of Beegu who crash landed on a strange planet called Earth. We then made this an entry into our Big Write Books. On Thursday, we linked our writing to our World Book Day by explaining who we dressed up as and why we dressed as that character. In Maths, we completed our addition work before moving onto subtraction. **Please note** that by the end of Year 2, all children are expected to add and subtract two 2-digit numbers where no regrouping is required (ie – $34 + 25$; $54 - 23$) so please continue to practise this with your child every so often! DIAMOND CLASS

This week in Literacy, Diamond Class have been learning about calligrams and have enjoyed creating their own using WordArt. They also used their creative imaginations to rewrite a piece of descriptive text, replacing particular vocabulary with calligrams. The children's maths focus this week was identifying pairs of parallel and perpendicular lines in 2D shapes and recognising the difference between a right angle, an acute angle and an obtuse angle. They also practised identifying angles in various shapes.

In Science, the class have been investigating how and why different objects reflect different amounts of light. We realised that the shinier the object, the more light it reflected.

As you know, Diamond Class' assembly has been changed to Wednesday 21st March. The children have been asked to read the script and practise their lines while remembering their cues over the weekend, so that we can practise without the script next week.

EMERALD CLASS

This week in English, the children in Emerald Class have been learning about the features of blurbs. We are planning to write our blurb for the story of Mufaro's Beautiful Daughters. During our maths lessons we have been focusing on using the inverse to find missing numbers and solve problems related to this. Our geography topic 'Are we damaging our world' highlighted the fact that there are thousands of living creatures that are endangered. The children created a word document based on an endangered creature and ways in which they can be helped. In science, the children investigated how light travels using torches and mirrors. It was at times tricky to use the mirrors to reflect the light, but through drawing diagrams the children understood that light travels in straight lines. In RE, we are investigating the themes within the Easter Story. We did some drama based on the story and the children recreated scenes where various themes were shown. A busy week! Well done Emerald Class.


