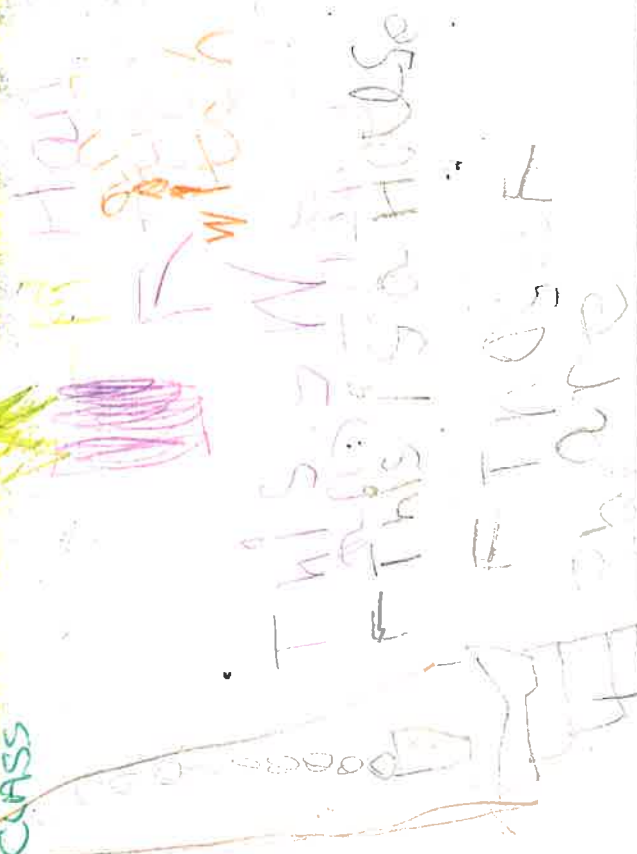

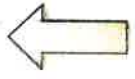


Questions to read and answer
