For parents in Emerald Class, I spoke again to the pupils who still need to pay their deposit for the Manor Adventure trip which will take place next June. It is important to note that this money goes towards all the fantastic building work that we have had completed at our school over the years. Without this fund we would never have been able to afford this work that has really benefitted the pupils. Therefore, it is very important that all parents continue to pay this annual contribution as any outstanding balance has to be paid by the school and this means that other areas will have to be cut back for example visits from poets, trips being subsidised.


