## HEADTEACHER'S NEWS

In our assemblies this week we have been discussing the 'no smoking at the school gates project' which our school is going to be part of. As part of our Healthy Schools' initiatives, both the Governors and I are very keen for St. John's School to be recognised as a school that is supporting this project. Mrs. Boyd, the Public Health Manager will speak to the pupils in assembly next week and raise the awareness of the importance of this by encouraging the pupils to participate in the no smoking at the school gates competition. This competition will run for two weeks, the closing date being the 14<sup>th</sup> March with the winners announced in the celebration assembly on the Friday. The prizes are 1<sup>st</sup> – a mini Ipad, 2<sup>nd</sup> £50 WH Smith voucher and 3<sup>rd</sup> £25 WH Smith voucher. The winning poster will be displayed on a plaque by the school gate.

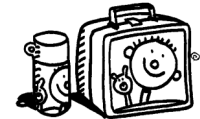
### Drop in Clinic to see the School Nurse
