

SAPPHIRE CLASS

Another great week of learning here in Sapphire Class. In maths this week, we have focused on measurement. We had a carousel activity day where we were able to complete a range of different measurement activities, including volume, length and weight. We used many different resources to help us complete these tasks and recorded our estimations and results in our own 'measurement activity booklet.' We have also been looking at reading scales where all divisions and numbers are given. Some of us have even looked at this task, but where not all numbers and divisions are given. This requires working out of what the scale is going up by before working out what the possible answer could be. A tricky concept, but we have tried really hard with this! In literacy, we have been focusing on setting description and we've linked this to Lizard Street, an East end of London Street where our fictional text Krindlek-rax is based. We have looked at our 5 senses and imagined, through drama, what it'd be like if we were on Lizard Street ourselves. We then planned our setting description before starting our writing about Lizard Street, which will continue into next week. Please note that on Tuesday, we are off to the Millfield Centre for the Jack and the Beanstalk production. It is important that we leave school on time so we can beat traffic and arrive at our destination before 10:00am. Therefore, it is imperative that everyone arrives to school on time on Tuesday so we can leave promptly. Also, we will be decorating our room for Christmas on Tuesday afternoon. If anybody would like to bring in any Christmas decorations for the classroom, then please feel free to bring these to school.

DIAMOND CLASS

This week in Diamond Class, our mathematical focus was measurement, therefore, the children focussed on measuring weight while baking fairy cakes! They learnt to measure ingredients, the importance of measuring accurately and using different types of scales. I was so impressed with how well all the children worked as a group! Also, the cakes were absolutely delicious! In Literacy, the children have been using their imaginations to begin writing their own mythical story as an alternative to 'Pandora's Box'. I'm really looking forward to reading their versions of this myth! The class have finally completed their moving monsters in D.T. and have started to decorate them. I have mentioned to the children that it would be a great idea to bring in any shoe boxes that could be used as the base for their monsters. A child shared their sample model using a shoe box and it looked great! In Science, the class have been learning about the importance of maintaining a balanced diet and the benefits of each food group. They have also been creating their own meal plans that reflect a balanced diet. This weekend, I have asked the children to read **4 more pages** of their Guided Reading book and write down what they like, or don't like about the story so far. I will be providing a task schedule featuring their reading tasks for each night that they can keep in their Reading Records, so that you are aware of what your child needs to do during their reading time each evening.
