### HEADTEACHER'S NEWS

As we are now in the festive season, both our classrooms and our assemblies have taken on the Christmas theme. Elena has also made a beautiful Advent wreath for us to have in all our assemblies where we have spent time this week talking about Advent and what each of the candles symbolise. As Christians, celebrating Advent involves spending time in spiritual preparation for the coming of Jesus Christ at Christmas.


## Spring Term 2018 Multi Skills & Dance Club
