Key issues addressed by the Governing Body during 2015/2016

- The GB has approved and overseen the construction of a new Year 5/6 classroom and accompanying intervention rooms
- The GB has approved and overseen the new management in the Early Years Foundation Stage
- The GB has ensured that all safeguarding procedures have been reviewed and that the Single Central Record is in place
- Governors have participated in Learning Walks in order to see the school in action
- Governors with an education background have participated in the moderation of writing in the school
- Governors come in to read with children as part of the drive to continually improve literacy
- Governors have conducted health and safety visits
- Governors have supported the Headteacher with challenging families
- Governors have attended training to ensure that they fulfil their statutory roles

Impact

The impact of the work of the Governing Body has been to strengthen leadership and management across the school. Governors supported the headteacher in changing the management of the Early Years Foundation Stage and this led to rapid improvement.

Governors have worked to ensure that Years 5 and 6 now have a state of the art classroom and improved facilities in which to work. The overall learning environment has been much improved during the 2015/2016 academic year.

Governors have received training in their role and in safeguarding so that they are able to fulfil their statutory requirements and act as a critical friend. Governance was considered a strength during the Local Authority review conducted in January 2016.
