

This is an opportunity for your child to tell us what they have been doing at the weekend. It is a lovely home/school link. Just let them 'have a go'.</p> <p>Have a discussion about how the changes in weather effects what you wear and eat.</p> <p>Support with cutting skills</p> <p>Please encourage your child to use a knife and fork as many children find this a difficult skill. Using their right and left hands at the same time will develop other areas of thinking and physical skills and it will help in readiness for Reception.</p>

<p>Continue to come to class on Thursdays at 12:45 to choose a home reading book with your child. Remember to take time to share books and continue to write in the yellow record book. We enjoy your feedback.</p> <p>Please support your child in writing their name using correct letter formation when they come into class.</p>	<p>Count everyday objects at home with your child and comment on numbers in the environment e.g. bus numbers, counting steps etc.</p> <p>Look out for patterns and shapes within the environment.</p> <p>Use the website below to access a fun way to support mathematics learning.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">www.topmarks.co.uk</p>	<p>Discuss with the child the changes they see around them – seasons, weather, plants etc.</p> <p>Encourage your child to ask questions about the world around them.</p> <p><u>R.E.</u> We shall be reading some of the stories which Jesus told. You can help your child by explaining that Jesus told wonderful stories and they are written in the bible.</p>	<p>Continue to allow your child to use a range of tools to cut and join materials.</p> <p>Encourage them to talk about the process they are using to make their model.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Remember we love to see any creations that your child makes at home!</p>



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
