HEADTEACHER'S NEWS SUMMARY NEWSLETTER



This week I talked to the pupils about Epiphany and why this is a very special time for Christians celebrating Jesus' birth, his baptism and the visit from the Magi to see Jesus in the stable in Bethlehem. We discussed why we thought the Magi were the last people to visit baby Jesus and why God chose the shepherds as the first visitors to see Jesus. A child read a passage from the book of Matthew in the New Testament describing the Magi's journey to visit Jesus and the difficult decision that they had to make in not returning to King Herod after they saw Jesus. If you have time this weekend it would be lovely for you to sit with your child and continue this story from the Book of Matthew as children will really enjoy the stories in this book outlining Jesus' life. Throughout this term we are going to explore the Book of Matthew, following Jesus' teachings and covering the Easter story in preparation for our special Easter services.

Having completed all our assessments last term, all staff are very clear about the teaching and learning that needs to take place this term. The Spring Term is always a very exciting time as this is the term where we really see pupils making great progress. It is important that parents are supporting their children's learning by listening to them read, practising times tables, ensuring that you check your child's homework, practise their spellings etc. If this is completed consistently, it is so rewarding to see the impact that this will have on your child's learning throughout the term. We will be holding our Parents' Evenings after half-term so that we can update you on where your child is half way through the school year.

RUBY CLASS

Two weeks in and Ruby class are well into the swing of their learning. Last week, we focused on 'Whatever Next' and this week we have looked at Julia's Donaldson's 'Room on the broom'.

In English, we have focused on rhyming words – what rhyming couplets can you think of at home? We are continuing to build on their phonics knowledge with a consolidation of their Set 1 sounds – which will take us up until February half term. In our independent writing, we started off the week with drawing and labelling their own Witch picture – we are encouraging independence and celebrating all writing attempts!

In maths, we have been focusing on numbers up to 5 and then 10, and using the vocabulary more than and less than.

Next week, the weather continues to be incredibly cold, so please ensure that your child comes in with labelled gloves, a hat and a scarf. We are really trying to help the class become independent with putting on their shoes, jackets etc, this is part of our EYFS curriculum so we ask that you continue to work on this at home too. We understand that is often due to speed, but we would appreciate your support with this.

SAPPHIRE CLASS

Our Sapphire children have welcomed Miss Moore, our trainee teacher, to our Sapphire team and have been working really well with her. Miss Moore is such a lovely addition to our team this half term.

English – We have completed another fantastic piece of writing. Comic Caption was the focus for this unit where children have learnt about the different sentence functions: statement, exclamation, question and command, and the correct punctuation for each of them.

Maths – We have been consolidating our understanding of subtraction methods through a variety of calculation strategies such as using number lines or mental calculation. We have also revisited the addition unit during the first week working on the skills and mathematical language needed.

Science – The children are exploring the properties and characteristics of different materials, identifying and testing different types of material to identify the correct purposes of use.

Religious Education – This half term, we are learning all about the Promises Christians make before God through understanding the meaning of church community, the meaning of Baptism, Christian marriage and exploring the concept of 'promise'.

In **PSHE**, we are learning all about being healthy, ways and choices. **History**: The focus this half term is on Change over time, understanding the concept of history. How people, building and ways of life change over time. **Ms Chebbi, Mrs Hargate, Mrs Hocyk and Miss Moore are very proud of you**

DIAMOND CLASS

Welcome back to Diamond Class, it has been lovely to have everyone in school after the Christmas break. We have jumped right back into learning, and I have been impressed how well the children have remembered routines and the thoughts and ideas we spoke about in Autumn term.

In Maths, the children have been practicing their column multiplication and bus stop division methods and I am confident now that everyone has achieved this, and this should really help them with the other topics we are looking at this term. In English, we have been writing excellent setting descriptions about the Amazon Rainforest and the children have loved finding out about the different layers of the forest and the various exotic animals that live there. In Science, we have started looking at rocks and testing to see what rock is the most suitable for various different criteria such as a house roof or kitchen work surface.

The most exciting part of our week has been swimming! It was an exciting opportunity to go out of school and Diamond Class represented St John's admirably. I was thoroughly impressed with all children getting into the water and showing off their skills. I look forward to seeing what badges the children earn over the next 10 weeks.

Please can I reiterate that homework is an important part of school life, it allows the children to practice skills that they have learnt, and this is key for them to progress. Every week I set MyMaths and Times Tables practice for all children, and this is pertinent to support them in all areas of the maths curriculum. Additionally, you should be reading with your child every night and completing the questions they have been set. I would like to see more children getting full marks in their spelling test each week so please ensure they are being practiced at home as well.

EMERALD CLASS

Wow, time is really moving quickly and I can't believe we are already two weeks into the new term.

In history we have been focusing on World War II which the children are thoroughly enjoying and this week we have been looking at the key events that happened throughout the war from the German invasion of Poland to the USA bombing Japan.

In maths over the last couple of weeks we have been focusing on shape-both 2D and 3D. The children have a much better understanding of how to describe the shapes, a few examples being parallel/perpendicular sides, rotational symmetry and lines of symmetry.

In science we looked at how animals have adapted and evolved over time, it is really amazing how some animals live and survive. Booster sessions for year 6 on a Wednesday morning are really crucial to help your child through their SATS in May and everybody did really well on the 2D shape questions I set last week. We will be having our booster lunch next Thursday. Have a great weekend and thank you for all of your kind birthday messages.
