This week in our assemblies we were discussing together the next project that St. John's School will embark on as part of our long-term commitment to the Bridge of Hope Charity. When Miss Bates was in Rukungiri, they were asked by the people there if they could fund the development of a protected spring so that everyone could have access to clean water. The Bridge of Hope agreed and gave them £1,400 to complete the project as they were so touched by the hardship that this community was facing on a daily basis. On our behalf, Miss Bates agreed that this would be our next project, so here we are with our next challenge of raising £1,400 as soon as we can. We would appreciate all donations via the donate button on the website and we will be holding an Easter raffle along with a cake sale on the 22nd March. Let's see how quickly we can raise this money for an extremely worthy cause.

We have organised a talk led by Miss Bates and members of the Bridge of Hope charity, for pupils and parents on Friday 15th March at 2.15pm in the school hall. Together as a school we can see the real challenges that this charity experienced on this trip and the more importantly the real difference that they are making to the lives of so many children and families in Rukungiri.

We are trying to start a Parents' Support Group so that there is an opportunity for parents to meet and chat over a cup of coffee about the real challenge that parenting can present from time to time. The first meeting took place yesterday and feedback was very positive from all parents. The next meeting is scheduled to take place on the 25th April from 1.30pm – 3pm. SAPPHIRE CLASS

Another busy and productive week. Please do keep up the home support, phonics, reading, handwriting, maths; it makes such a difference to your child's confidence and self-esteem.

English – This week the children have enjoyed writing their special Mother's Day poems showing love and gratitude. So, expect a lovely surprise to cherish this weekend dear mothers and carers.

Maths – Maths learning is based around understanding multiplication and division facts: repeated addition, grouping, odd and even numbers and family number facts.

Science – The children are exploring the properties and characteristics of plants, identify and naming a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. Please have a look around as the trees are blossoming and the spring plants are blooming, see which ones have survived the winter and which were deciduous.

Religious Education – We are learning about Saints, what they are and what good things they do to become Saints; discussing the qualities that make someone a Saint, applying the idea of being Saints to our own life and the lives of those around us. The children will be taking part in an educational trip next week to learn all about Easter story.

In **PSHE**, we are learning about goals, achievements and what we need to fulfil them. Working in unity and harmony.

Geography: We have been exploring the sources of our food – provenance, the different types of farming: arable - pastoral farming and what they produce.

DIAMOND CLASS

Another successful week in Diamond Class. I am happy that we are making significant progress in all areas of the curriculum. We are in our last push for the Spring term ahead of our assessments before the Easter Holidays.

In maths, the children have been looking at fractions and have grasped the concepts well. Times tables is really important here and continued practice on this is vital and I am noticing that this the homework set is not regularly completed by a significant number of children in the class. Thank you for working hard on spellings at home, I have noticed a big improvement in their attitude and results from this, could I please ask that this same level of effort is put into times tables as well.

In English, the children have thoroughly enjoyed looking at Pompeii and the volcanic eruption from 79CE from Mount Vesuvius, this links brilliantly to our Roman topic from before half term and our current Geography topic of Earthquakes and Volcanoes. The children have been looking at famous volcanoes from across the world this week in our Geography lesson. Please allow your children to research about these volcanoes and their location to support and extend their understanding.

I sent out a letter regarding our RE trip next Thursday, this trip is really important for the children to gain an insight into the Easter story, please can the permission slip be brought back as soon as possible. As mentioned in the letter children are to wear school uniform but can wear trainers for the walk.
