SAPPHIRE CLASS

We are having such a productive and fun half term; the children have made a remarkable progress. Keep up the home support please, it makes such a difference.

English – We have completed another fantastic piece of writing. The focus was on writing a setting description based on the famous story 'The Great Race' by Christopher Corr. The children have been learning how to use noun phrases and expanded noun phrases to bring the story to life.

Maths – The children have enjoyed learning about statistics and the different ways of interpreting data into various charts and diagrams (data table, tally chart, block diagram, bar charts and pictograms).

Science – The children are exploring the properties and characteristics of different materials, identifying and testing different types of material to identify the correct purposes of use.

Religious Education – This half term, we are learning all about the Promises Christians make before God through understanding the meaning of church community, the meaning of Baptism, Christian marriage and exploring the concept of 'promise'. We will be visiting the church to explore this further with Mother Mitzi on the 9th February.

In **PSHE**, we are learning all about being healthy, ways and choices. **History**: The focus this half term is on Change over time, understanding the concept of history. How people, building and ways of life change over time.

DIAMOND CLASS

It should be a fun and exciting day full of various Roman activities which I know the children will enjoy.

Please keep up the excellent work you are doing at home with spellings and times tables, these really have an impact in all areas of learning for the children and help them be more productive and independent in the classroom.

EMERALD CLASS

Another week has flashed by and the children in Emerald class have been working extremely hard across a number of subjects.

On Tuesdays over the last few weeks we have been participating in workshops run by a financial company called MyBnk. They have been teaching the children all about different aspects of finance, including interest rates, taxes, disposable income, bills and how to save. They have really enjoyed the interactive sessions and I believe it is so important that they have an understanding of money before they enter the big wide world.

In history we have been looking into World War II; over the last couple of weeks we looked at the story of an evacuee and also rationing and how it worked.
