RUBY CLASS

It has been so lovely welcoming the children back to a newly-refurbished Ruby Class. We have been learning all about the changing seasons and are looking forward to the warm spring weather.

As of next Tuesday, we are asking the children to come in in their PE kits so that we can maximize learning time in the morning. Our timetable has moved onto both daily phonics and reading sessions. SAPPHIRE CLASS

A happy and successful week of the second half term. Please do keep up the home support, phonics, reading, handwriting, maths; it makes such a difference to your child's confidence and self-esteem.

English – We have started a new piece of writing based on our enjoyable walk to Hilly Fields. The children are using their writing skills to produce a recount of this experience including descriptive language and interesting vocabulary.

Maths – The focus, once more in Maths, is on place value. Understanding numbers through partitioning as the value is represented by a digit on the basis of its position in a number.

Science – The children are exploring the properties and characteristics of plants, identify and naming a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. Please have a look around as the trees are blossoming and the spring plants are blooming, see which ones have survived the winter and which were deciduous.

Religious Education – We ae learning about Saints, what they are and what good things they do to become Saints; discussing the qualities that make someone a Saint and applying the idea of being Saints to our own life and the life of those around us.

In **PSHE**, we are learning about goals, achievements and we need to fulfil them.

Geography: The focus is on Uganda, The Bridge of Hope Charity, the country's characteristics; human and physical geography and how this charity helps people in Uganda. Next Tuesday at 2.15pm, Miss Bates will be talking to the class about her experience in Uganda and the next project that we are going to embark on.

DIAMOND CLASS

A lovely start to the second half the Spring term. We are officially over half-way through the school year now which is exciting! Thank you so much to all parents who provided the children with costumes for our Roman Day, the children thoroughly enjoyed it, and it helped them with their understanding of concepts that happened thousands of years ago.

I am delighted with how the children have come back into school with the best, positive attitude to learning. This attitude has meant we are able to hit the ground running with all the amazing things we are learning about.

In English, we have been delving deeper into our Roman topic from last half term looking at trying to persuade Mrs Notley to become a gladiator. The children have enjoyed learning the skills of persuasion so you may find that they start trying to persuade you to do something with the knowledge they have learnt. We have been revisiting addition in Maths with a key focus on word problems to help them with their reasoning paper. Children have been applying their knowledge of the column method to answer these complex problems.

In Science we have begun to look at plants and what requirements they need to be successful, in the next coming weeks we will be looking at growing our own plants which I am sure the children will enjoy. In RE, the children are starting to look at the Ten Commandments and the Easter story through our value of compassion.

As always, please ensure you are reading at home with your children to increase their stamina and fluency. It is also pertinent that any homework in their orange book is completed to a high standard as we are holding children accountable for their presentation, and they will be asked to redo this if it is not appropriate. My Maths and Times Tables homework has been set for this week and I am really pushing to have 100% completion of both this half-term. Spellings are really important and this is something we are having a big push on this half term. Please ensure these are practised daily at home.
