

<u>RUBY CLASS</u> What a fantastic week we've had in Ruby Class! It's been a whirlwind of creativity, exploration, and joyful learning.

The highlight of our week was celebrating World Book Day — the children looked amazing in their costumes, and we had so much fun making our own books and sharing our favourite stories. Inspired by the sunny weather, we took our learning outside, working together to clean and rearrange the Sunshine Room. The children showed great teamwork and imagination as they planned a new layout to make the most of our outdoor space.

We've been closely observing the signs of spring, learning how to care for the insects we've spotted, and singing songs about planting seeds. The children planted their own seed pots and helped turn over the soil in our garden — we're all excited to see how our garden display will bloom soon!

In maths, we've been consolidating our understanding of numbers by playing doubles games and starting to explore odd and even numbers. It's been wonderful to see the children's confidence grow as they apply their number knowledge in playful and practical ways.

Our reading groups have also ventured outside this week, taking advantage of the beautiful weather, and we continue to see great progress in the children's reading skills. A highlight earlier in the week was making fruit kebabs after reading *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* — it feels like such a long time ago already!

We also enjoyed Pancake Day with some deliciously decorated pancakes and some very funny songs. The Ash Wednesday service at St. John's Church was a peaceful and reflective moment — the children sat beautifully and made us so proud. They are a credit to Ruby Class and to our school.

<u>SAPPHIRE CLASS</u> Welcome back to the second half of Spring term! With brighter weather ahead, let's embrace this season of hope, growth and renewal.

English – The Comet - The story this time is about Nyla, a little girl who moved from living by the seaside with her dad to the hustle and bustle of city life, where she created her own magical world to fill the space she had long missed. In this unit, the focus is on the art of descriptive writing, creating captivating posters, crafting expressive poems and telling engaging narratives painting vivid pictures with words.

Maths – We are consolidating and advancing the four core operational math skills—addition, subtraction, multiplication and division by using advanced strategies and exploring new methods. This approach will deepen understanding, boost problem-solving skills and help to apply these concepts with improved efficiency and mastery.

Science – In this unit, we will identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including both deciduous and evergreen trees. This is the perfect time to explore and appreciate the beauty of God's creation all around us. Let's take this opportunity to connect with nature and admire the wonders that surround us!

Religious Education - In this unit, we'll explore why saints are important to Christians. Saints are role models of faith, showing how to live like Jesus. Christians believe saints can pray for them and guide them. Through feast days, saints' lives inspire believers to grow closer to God and live with purpose. This ties into our value of living as a nurturing community at St. John's, where we support and uplift one another in faith and love.

PSHE - In this unit, we'll focus on healthy living and making positive choices. This includes eating nutritious foods, staying active, getting rest and taking care of our mental and emotional well-being leading to strength, happiness and resilience.

History – We are learning about Florence Nightingale and her achievements. She transformed healthcare with her focus on hygiene and patient care, especially during the Crimean War. Her work laid the foundation for modern nursing and continues to inspire healthcare today.

A blessed Lent season to all and Ramadan Mubarak to our Muslim community! May this time be filled with reflection, peace and spiritual growth.

DIAMOND CLASS

Thank you to all parents who attended Parents' Evening, it was lovely to be able to discuss your child's progress and answer any questions. Please do use the resources I provided and tips to help your child meet their target I have set. As always please do not hesitate to get in touch if needed.

In Maths we have been looking at adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator and then looking to find fractions of an amount. An underlying theme here was number bonds and reading each question carefully. When finding a fraction of an amount, the denominator tells us how many groups we have in total not the number in each group.

In English, we have continued our research on tea to prepare us for writing our non-chronological report next week. The children have learnt lots of grammatical features such as prepositions and different sentences which I will be looking to see in their writing.

In Geography, we are looking at Settlements. We have started to investigate the how land is used in our school's local area using Ordinance Survey (OS) maps. You can do this for the area you live using a map online. The children have been looking to find what type of land use (commercial, residential, agricultural, recreational or transport) is the most popular in our local area. What is the most popular where you live?

In Computing, we have been looking at collaborating online together through the Microsoft Software. Please could you give your child an opportunity to have a go at touch typing (using the correct fingers on a keyboard) as they are currently only using their index fingers, and this is taking them a long time. BBC bitesize or Typing Club are free websites that teach this, and the children love them!

You may find your child wants to watch Finding Nemo this weekend! We watched the beginning clip as we were looking at animal groups yesterday in Science (birds, fish, amphibians, reptiles and mammals). We were discussing what fish eggs look like and why some animal groups produce more than 1 young. This clip was excellent for showing this.

MyMaths and Times Tables have been set as usual,

EMERALD CLASS

In English this week we have been looking at the story of Beowulf. The children have created some bloodthirsty diary entries through the eyes of Grendel. The use of descriptive language was excellent and it certainly scared me!! In maths we have been consolidating our long division and multiplication strategies and have also looked at using decimals with multiplication and division. The children have worked well on this.

Our geography topic this half-term is Uganda; we have looked at the characteristics and key facts of our sponsor country including it is one of the countries in the world that has the largest amount of different land animals.

In art we have been looking at Frida Kahlo and how inspirational she was. The children drew some fantastic portraits and next lesson we will look at creating these with paints. It was great seeing everybody at parents' evening, please remember to make sure your children are doing all of their homework as we are in a crucial time of the year, especially for year 6.


