Friday 4th April - Autism Acceptance Day at St. John's C of E Primary School

On Friday the 4th April we will be celebrating the contribution that autistic pupils at our school make to enriching our entire school community. It is time that we really focus on our autistic pupils but also thinking about all autistic people and highlighting the wonderful gifts that they have been given by God. We acknowledge the strengths, achievements and uniqueness of people who are on the Autism spectrum. Every autistic pupil at our school places their hand print on our school community, marking their own contribution to our school. We invite everyone to wear blue on this day and to contribute £2 to the Autistic Society.

Thank you to all the parents who completed the recent online safety questionnaire, it is helpful for us to receive this feedback so that we can further support you in this very challenging and ever evolving area of every child's life. We have organised a session for parents to be supported in setting up the correct parental controls on your child's device on 28 April at 2.15pm and also on 14 July at 2.15pm. The internet is a big part of children's lives in the UK, with children spending 2 to 5 hours online daily (OFCOM, 2024). It helps them make friends, learn, and be creative. However, the internet also has risks, such as exposure to harmful content and online abuse.

However, safeguarding is everyone's responsibility and while it is never possible to remove risk entirely, parents and carers also have a duty to ensure their children are kept safe and are able to manage risk effectively both in the real world and online. Our parental guide is designed to help families to develop safe and healthy internet use using the TECH approach. It is research-based, practical and trauma-informed.

<u>SAPPHIRE CLASS</u> The days are getting brighter, and the children's enthusiasm for school and learning is at an all-time high. They continue to impress us with their energy and eagerness.

English – We have just completed a special poster for selling Nyla's house by the sea, taking on the role of estate agents. We are now diving into the joy of free, creative and imaginative writing, applying the skills we have learned so far. Handwriting continues to be a key focus in our presentations across all subjects.

Maths – We have been learning about mass and weight, recognising different units and comparing various masses, while revisiting comparison symbols. We have also been practising reading digital scales and using balance scales. You can encourage your child to find the weights on items while shopping and discuss why a specific measuring unit is used.

Science – In this unit, we have identified and named a range of common wild and garden plants, including both deciduous and evergreen trees. It has been the perfect time to explore and appreciate the beauty of God's creation all around us as we have embraced the opportunity to connect with nature and marvel at the wonders that surround us!

Religious Education - The children are learning about the symbols of Easter and how they help us connect with the true meaning of this holy season. Through exploring these symbols, they are discovering how Easter celebrates the hope, love, and new beginnings that come from God's sacrifice and resurrection. Our recent Easter experience trip further enriched their learning, allowing them to travel back in time and relive the story of Christ's journey. This experience deepened their understanding of how Easter brings us closer to God and reminds us of the hope and renewal we find in His love.

PSHE - we are focusing on living a healthy lifestyle and making positive choices. This includes eating nutritious foods, staying active, getting enough rest and caring for our mental and emotional well-being. All of these contribute to building strength, happiness and resilience.

History – we have been exploring the life and achievements of Florence Nightingale. We are learning how she revolutionised healthcare with her emphasis on hygiene and patient care, particularly during the Crimean War. DIAMOND CLASS

A lovely week of sunshine! Thank you to those parents who attended the Maths workshop for Year 3 this week, it was lovely to share some tips and tricks regarding reasoning with you. If you were unable to attend, the paper has been sent home with your child which you can look at and go through in your own time.

This is just a reminder that next Tuesday 25th March, I will be delivering another Maths workshop, this time to Year 4 parents. Please do attend if possible as it is really helpful to understand how we teach maths at St. John's and how best you can help your child at home.

In English, we have started our new book called The Lion and The Unicorn. This is a story about bravery and courage, during the war. The children have begun this week by creating their dialogue based on a scene in the book.

In Science, we have looked at different ways to classify animals using a table or using a branched diagram. This can be easily replicated at home by giving your child different animals such as a snake, a frog and a bee. We are looking forward to our end of term trip to Hillyfields to investigate some animals further.

In Geography, we have been looking at land use in New Delhi, India. Once we have completed our trip to Enfield Town next week, we will be able to compare land use in two different places around the world.

In D&T, we are continuing our special project for Mother's Day. The children have been amazing so far using lots of special equipment. Can I please have a photo of you (Mum's) with your child in Diamond Class to fit into our project? If you can send me your photo by next Friday 28th March via email.


