The season of advent is upon us again! Last Sunday was the first Sunday in the period of Advent when we think about how as Christians we prepare for the birth of Jesus Christ on Christmas Day. During the period of Advent, we will be relating to the themes of hope, peace, joy and love which are symbolised by the Advent candles on our Advent wreath (one candle is lit every Sunday of Advent and in our Celebration Assembly every Friday in the lead up to Christmas).

I am afraid that we will be saying a fond farewell to Mrs. Hocyk as she heads off to pastures new with her family. Mrs Hocyk has been at St. John's School for seven and a half years now and in that time, she has carried out many roles in a very diligent and passionate way. The latest Parent Questionnaire that was completed by 52 parents is on the school's website for you to view. We really appreciate that you took the time to complete this as we always welcome feedback so that we can celebrate all the successes at our school and look at how we can be even better. There are just a few comments from the questionnaire that I would like to address in this newsletter, the first being the lack of a PTA at our school. During my time of being Headteacher here, I have made several attempts to try to set one up but have never been successful in getting parents to volunteer to take on the post of Chair or Vice-Chair. Whilst I appreciate this is a big commitment, we need a large number on the Committee to run social events successfully, and to have it correctly structured so that we could apply for charity status. Otherwise, this work ultimately lands on the staff which is not appropriate for many reasons: a very high number of my staff are involved in running either before or after school clubs which guarantees continuity for the pupils, a high standard of behavior and excellent delivery. Furthermore, our strong commitment to competitive sport involves at least three members of staff to guarantee that it all runs smoothly. Finally, being a small school has many challenges in terms of the work load of all staff whereby we all have to wear many hats in order to fulfil the requirements that are necessary to run this school successfully. Therefore, the governors are forever mindful of their duty of care to all staff whilst also ensuring that the standards remain consistently high across the school.

I am so fortunate to have a highly committed and passionate staff and certainly wouldn't want to jeopardize this in any way that would be detrimental to the high standards that we have worked tirelessly to achieve. However, we will endeavor to ensure that from next term, every class will have at least one trip a term and where possible we will try to increase the number of weeks that we can run clubs as long as it doesn't interfere with staff training.

Please take the time to look at the dates attached to this newsletter as the final weeks of the Autumn Term are always filled with many festive activities. I look forward to seeing as many parents as possible at these special events where undoubtedly your children will shine like stars.

Finally, on behalf of everyone at St. John's School, I would like to wish you a very peaceful and enjoyable Christmas and all our very best wishes for 2026. Thank you for all your support throughout this year and for always being a pleasure to work with.

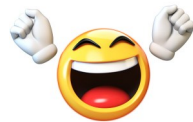

RUBY CLASS

Ruby has been such a joyful place lately and I just wanted to share a little of what we have been up to. We are deep in Nativity mode and the children have truly amazed us. They are learning the story beautifully and have been so brave practising their lines. Watching them step into their characters with such confidence has been a real highlight. They make us so proud every single day.

Our little visiting Elf has caused a fair bit of excitement too. He has been doing his usual silly tricks, of course, but also showing a surprising amount of kindness. One night he even sat and read all of our name cards so that he could learn everyone's name. The children were absolutely beside themselves the next morning.

We have also been spending lots of time strengthening our fine motor skills. This is such an important part of early development and the children have been working so hard with their cutting, threading, dough activities and all those tiny finger movements that help with early writing. They really are giving it their all.

In Science we have embraced full, glorious, messy sensory play. Oobleck, instant snow, jelly slime, colour mixing finger paints... if it squishes or pours or drips, we have probably tried it. The children adore it! We do try our best to remember aprons... Our apologies to parents for any glitter (and the likes) that might mysteriously appear at home.

We are so excited for our Nativity and all the festive moments still to come. Ruby has grown so much already this term - they are kind, curious, funny and full of wonder. Every day with Ruby brings something new to celebrate and we could not be prouder of them.

SAPPHIRE CLASS

As we approach the end of our first term, we are delighted to reflect on what has been a joyful and successful term full of growth. The children have shown enthusiasm, curiosity and resilience in their learning and we are so proud of the progress they are making.

Writing - The children have been developing a wide range of writing tools, especially focusing on editing and proofreading skills. They are learning to apply valuable structural techniques to make their writing clearer, more expressive and truly exceptional for this time of year. We kindly encourage you to seize opportunities at home to support your child with their writing presentation, neatness and sentence composition as this helps them continue to flourish.

Maths – We are learning a range of strategies for addition and subtraction and deepening our understanding of how numbers relate to each other. The children have been exploring number bonds to 10, 20 and 100, recognising how these patterns help them work more efficiently and confidently with larger numbers. They are beginning to see how these number relationships support both mental and written calculations. It has been fantastic to see them apply their strategies, explain their reasoning and become more independent mathematicians.

Religious Education - We are learning about the different roles and their significance in the Christmas story. The children have been reflective and insightful, exploring how each figure shows **faith, courage** and **trust** in God. They are beginning to understand how the Christian message of Christmas inspires people to live with **kindness, hope** and **generosity** in the world today.

Science - We are learning about different materials and their properties. The children have been investigating how materials such as wood, metal, fabric and plastic are used and why. Through sorting, testing and comparing activities, they are exploring which materials are best suited to specific purposes. The children are developing their scientific enquiry skills, asking thoughtful questions and explaining their findings with increasing confidence.

We are so proud of all the progress Sapphire Class has made this term across all subjects. Thank you for your continued support; we look forward to another wonderful new term together.

DIAMOND CLASS We've had a busy and exciting week of learning, and the children have really impressed me with their curiosity and creativity across subjects.

In Maths this week, we have been tackling reasoning problems around multiplication and division. These have been more challenging, requiring the children to carefully consider what each question is asking. Success has still relied heavily on their times tables knowledge, so regular practice at home continues to be invaluable.

We've begun our new class book in English, *The Iron Man*. The children were captivated by meeting the giant and have produced some fantastic descriptive writing using similes. Their imaginative language has brought the character vividly to life.

Our Science lessons have been hands-on and exciting! We've been exploring different types of rocks, creating our own fossils and even experimenting to make metamorphic rocks. The children loved seeing how rocks can change and transform.

In Geography, we've investigated the positives and negatives of volcanoes and earthquakes. The children thought carefully about whether they would choose to live near one themselves, weighing up the risks and benefits with great insight.

In RE, children are learning that Advent and Epiphany are showing Christians the true meaning of Christmas. Through the prophets, John the Baptist and Mary, children are discovering that Jesus' birth is being planned by God long before it happens. They are exploring how the Wise Men's visit is showing that Jesus is coming for everyone, bringing hope and light to the world. By the end of the unit, children are reflecting on how Christians are living out the message of Christmas through faith, kindness and sharing God's love with others.

Next week is **Assessment Week for Diamond Class**. Please help your child by practising their times tables over the weekend, making sure they get plenty of sleep each night, and starting each day with a good breakfast so they are ready to concentrate. Full attendance is very important, as any missed assessments will need to be caught up later. The children have worked hard and are well prepared to show what they can do. I am so proud of the effort the children have put in so far, and with your support at home, they will be able to approach these assessments with confidence.

EMERALD CLASS In Emerald class over the last two weeks we have been looking at the book *Hidden Figures* - a book about racism and sexism. We have had some thoughtful and lively chats about these topics and the children have thoroughly enjoyed looking into the four main characters who showed great resilience, determination and integrity. From this stimulus the children have produced some excellent pieces of writing, both formal and informal - showing the value of reading thought-provoking and interesting books.

In maths we have been really focusing on measurement and converting different units of measurement, which some of the children have found tricky. In our geography topic based around The Alps the children have researched key facts about the region and also looked at both the key human and physical factors in the region.

In RE, children are exploring how Christians might "advertise" Christmas to show its true meaning today. They are learning that Christmas is not only a joyful celebration, but a reminder of the Incarnation - God coming to Earth as Jesus. Through art and music, children are seeing how the Christmas message is communicated creatively. They are also examining the difference between secular and religious celebrations and reflecting on what matters most to Christians. Finally, they are expressing how Christians today share the message of Christmas through worship, kindness and living out Jesus' teachings.

One of the favourite lessons during the last few weeks has been design and technology where the children have created 'Doodlers' - devices controlled by a circuit and a counter balance which enable it to move and draw.

As we draw even closer to Christmas it is extremely important that your child is up-to-date with all of their homework and reading so that they can go into the Christmas holidays with everything completed.

Next week is assessment week, so it is really important that your child is in school for the whole week.
