Next Friday the 13th February, we will be holding our first Eucharist Service in St. John's Church at 2.15pm and all parents are most welcome to attend this very special service. Pupils and staff from Diamond and Emerald classes will be participating in this service with pupils from Emerald class playing key roles throughout the service. Throughout this half-term, Mother Mitzi has been discussing the Eucharist during Collective Worship. This has helped the children to deepen their understanding of Christianity, and what it means to share in the sacraments of the church.

***Jesus breaks bread and gives it to His disciples, saying, 'This is my body.'* Mark 14:22-24** – we use this verse from the Bible to explain the Eucharist to children.

***Jesus takes the cup and gives it to His disciples, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood.'* Luke 22:19-20** – we use this verse to help the children to understand the significance of the Eucharist.

Today we held our first fundraising for this year to support the education of our ten sponsored pupils in Uganda who are linked to the Bridge of Hope Charity. Every year we need to raise a total of £700, last year we exceeded this total by raising £840 which was superb as it meant that we could offer the charity some extra money for any emergencies that they may have to cover. Thank you to the pupils in both the Eco-Committee and the School Council who helped to organize this event. Next week is Safer Internet Week where we will be running a number of activities throughout the school to continue to raise pupils' awareness of how they keep themselves safe whilst using the internet. We are also holding a meeting for all parents at 2.30pm on the 12th February to talk about this very important topic but also to support you in making sure that you have the correct parental controls on your children's devices. We are very fortunate to have an Associate member of the Governing Body, Mr. Nath, available to be able to assist and advise you with regard to the correct parental controls that you should have installed on your children's devices. Please let the office know, if you would like to book an appointment with Mr. Nath for this vital support. Please take the time to look at our section on online safety on the website as we have some very helpful information to support you with navigating the many challenges that this can present for parents and children.

We will also be celebrating Children's Mental Health next week as well through talks and many different activities with pupils to raise the importance of looking after our mental health. In KS2 we have been running a very successful project called Brain Buddies to raise pupils' awareness of how they can look after their mental health. Feedback from the pupils has been extremely positive so we will definitely be looking into running this again next year.

I am delighted to welcome Rock Steady back to school on Friday 13th March (please note that this has been moved from next Friday), for a special concert led by them to show case what they offer the many pupils who are already participating in this exciting activity. If you are interested in finding out more about Rock Steady, do please come along as you are definitely guaranteed to enjoy this event, and may well be very keen for your child to be part of this in the future.

Online Safety Tip 4: 🧑🏫 Online scams

Children are growing up in a world full of information—videos, messages, adverts, and posts appear everywhere they go online. While much of this content is fun and educational, some of it is designed to trick people. Teaching children how to recognise scams and fake news helps them stay safe, think critically, and make good choices online.

Online scams and false information can:

- Pretend to offer prizes, gifts or free items
- Ask for personal details such as names, passwords, or bank information
- Use fake stories or shocking headlines to grab attention
- Spread rumours or misinformation that can worry or confuse children
- Appear in games, videos, adverts and social media

Scammers and creators of fake news often make things look *real*, so children need clear guidance on what to trust.

🔍 What to Look For

Warning Sign	What It Might Mean	Tip
Pop-up saying, "You've won!"	It could be scam trying to trick you.	Close it and tell an adult
Headlines that seem believable	The story might be made up	Check with a trusted adult or website
Messages asking for passwords	No real game or website will ask for this information	Never share passwords with anyone.
Videos or pictures with no source	The information may have been faked	Ask, "Who made this?" before believing it

🗨️ Safe online rules for children

- Never click on pop-ups offering prizes or gifts
- Tell a trusted adult if something looks strange or too good to be true
- Don't share personal information - no passwords, addresses or codes
- Check facts using trusted websites or by asking an adult
- Remember not everything online is real!

🧠 Building Healthy Online Habits

- Talk regularly about what children see online
- Encourage them to ask questions if something feels odd
- Show them how to check if information is from a trusted source
- Use parental controls and privacy settings on all apps
- Remind them that it is always okay to ask for help

RUBY CLASS What a brilliant start to the new year we've had in Ruby Class! Even with all the rain, the children have brought so much joy and energy to everything we've been doing. Inside the classroom, we've been keeping busy with *lots* of rearranging (sometimes almost daily!), and the children have really enjoyed taking ownership of their learning space. We've spent a great deal of time exploring Numicon, using it to deepen our understanding of numbers through hands-on activities and games. The children's early writing is also going from strength to strength. We were especially proud to welcome the governors into Ruby Class this morning — they joined us for a reading, writing and phonics morning and were so impressed by the children's enthusiasm, teamwork, and growing skills. Ruby Class truly showed why we always say:

"Teamwork makes the dream work... and Ruby Class is a dream!"

Whenever the weather has allowed it, we've made the most of getting outside. We were overjoyed to see the first daffodils already blooming in Catriona's garden, and we enjoyed a lovely walk to Hilly Fields as part of the RSPB Birdwatch. Along the way, we bumped into Mother Mitzi and her dog, Lucy. She introduced us to a fantastic app that listens to birdsong and identifies the birds — the children were absolutely captivated (when they managed to stand quietly enough) to hear the different calls.

Pjama Day has been a huge hit and brought plenty of excitement! We looked at pictures from the Bridge of Hope Charity and talked about how our donations are going to children that don't get to play with as many toys as us. It has also been a special day for us to say thank you and farewell to our wonderful work-experience student, Miss Lily. We've loved having her with us for the past two weeks, and she will be dearly missed by both staff and children. This month, our RE lessons have been enriched by Ms Chebbi joining us. Together, we've explored stories including **The Lost Sheep**, **Jesus in the Temple**, and **Feeding the 5000**. We're also looking forward to baking our own bread next week to share — just as Jesus did in the story.

SAPPHIRE CLASS

As we approach the end of this successful half term, it has been wonderful to see the children's enthusiasm and growing confidence in their learning. They have been busy developing key skills across the curriculum through exciting and meaningful opportunities.

English - In English, we have been developing our writing skills through a good understanding of grammar rules, correct letter formation and improved presentation. The children are also practising spelling regularly to build confidence and accuracy. Using the book *Lizzy and the Cloud*, pupils are describing settings using **prepositions and prepositional phrases**. They are learning how to add detail to their writing by explaining where things are, for example "Above the city," "On the beach," or "Behind the buildings," helping them to create clear and imaginative descriptions.

Maths - In Maths, we have been learning addition and subtraction strategies within and across 10. Pupils are consolidating their number bonds and developing fluency in this area. They use practical resources, number lines and visual methods to support their understanding and are encouraged to explain their thinking, solve simple problems and choose the correct operation with confidence.

Science - In Science, pupils continue to explore living things and the natural world. They are learning what makes something alive and how to group and classify plants and animals. Through observation and discussion, children are developing curiosity about the environment around them and understanding basic needs such as food, water and shelter.

RE - In RE, we have been putting our learning into action. The children recently helped clear dead leaves and do some gardening around the school, planting the bulbs they grew in Science last half term. This links closely to our learning about responsibility and gratitude to God by taking care of His creation. Pupils explored the question, "What responsibility has God given people about taking care of creation?" and learn about Creation in the Old Testament, stewardship and what it means to care for people, animals and the environment.

Art - Our art project is coming along beautifully. The children are recycling all your donated newspapers and using them creatively in their work. Thank you for your support with resources - it has really helped bring the project to life.

Dear God, Thank you for the joy our children bring each day. Please bless Sapphire class as they learn, grow and care for one another and your world. **Amen.**

DIAMOND CLASS We've had a wonderfully busy and exciting couple of weeks in class, and the children have thrown themselves into every subject with enthusiasm.

In English, we have launched our new book in a rather unexpected way—by discovering piles of “rubbish” left on the tables! The children worked brilliantly to sort the items into different categories, sparking curiosity and setting the scene for an exciting literary journey ahead. It's been a fantastic hook, and we can already see their imaginations firing.

In Maths the focus has been fractions, and the children are really enjoying the challenge. They've begun spotting patterns across lessons, which is helping them retain and apply their knowledge with growing confidence. To make learning meaningful, we've been using the image of a Dairy Milk chocolate bar as it already divided into “parts”—to explore how fractions work in real life. Have a look at home to see how many everyday items are split into fractions

In Science, we have continued our work on light, and the children have loved the practical investigations. One highlight was turning off all the lights and creating shadows around the classroom, using furniture and objects to explore how shadows form. We also discussed how to stay safe in the sun, linking our learning to real-world situations.

In RE, we have been learning about the “I AM” statements of Jesus and what they show about who He is and how He guides people. We explored how Jesus describes Himself in different ways, such as light, bread and shepherd, and what these images mean for Christians. Through discussion, we reflected on how these words help believers understand Jesus' role and how His teachings influence the way they live.

Reflection to take away:

What do the words we choose about ourselves say about how we try to live and treat others?

Our journey into the world of the ancient Romans continues, and the children's enthusiasm is infectious. Roman Day was a standout moment of January—a brilliant escape from the gloomy weather—and the children are still talking about it. Do take a look at the photos on our school website; they capture the day and their costumes beautifully.

We're thrilled to be extending this learning even further with our trip to the Verulamium Museum on **Monday**. Please ensure your child comes in **full school uniform**, brings a **coat**, and has a **packed lunch** for the day.

EMERALD CLASS

Today we are due to have our debating, which I know the children are looking forward to, in preparation for the 'Great Debate' competition organised by the Enfield Town Partnership. I am looking forward to some 'controlled' arguing and seeing who can think on their feet and potentially be the future Prime Minister.

In maths we have been focusing on decimals and fractions. The children have made great progress and hopefully will remember everything that has been taught. In history we have been looking at World War II with particular focus on the evacuee children and also how women played a crucial part in the whole war effort. I have booked a trip for the 9th March where we will visit The Imperial War Museum' so look out for information nearer the time.

Time is moving on very quickly; with SATS looming in the not too distant future, it is crucial that all homework is being completing to a high standard and that attendance at Booster sessions is on a regular basis. If children find anything difficult I have told them on numerous occasions to come and speak to me early in the week or if ever you need anything clarifying please pop in and see me in the morning.

In RE, we have been learning about Buddhism and what it means to follow the Buddhist way of life. We explored what causes suffering and how it can be overcome, learned about the Noble Eightfold Path and how it guides daily actions, and discovered key ideas such as samsara and nirvana. We also learned about the importance of the Sangha and what it means to belong to the Buddhist community. Through discussion and reflection, we considered what it means to live by the teachings of a faith in everyday life.

reflection to take away:

How are the teachings of different faiths similar, and how can following them shape the choices a person makes?

I hope you have a relaxing weekend and let's hope the weekend is not a wet and dreary one.
