RUBY CLASS Ruby class has been thoroughly enjoying all things outdoors and springtime! We have been completely engrossed in our sunflower seedlings, watching them carefully each day as they grow. The children have loved measuring them, checking name labels to see which plant belongs to them, putting the pots into size order, and looking closely for any minibeasts that might be visiting.

We've also been tending very lovingly to Catriona's garden, harvesting the last of the beautiful daffodils and tulips. A particularly thoughtful moment came when the children suggested gifting some flowers to Sapphire and some to Mrs Notley—which put big smiles on their faces!

Our gardening adventures didn't stop there. After our visit to the garden centre, where the children chose what they wanted to grow, we've been busy sowing lots of vegetable seeds. We now have tomatoes, broad beans, broccoli, carrots, strawberries, pumpkins, and more growing away. The children even had the brilliant idea to plant seeds from their watermelon snack—we'll see what happens! There are already grand plans to set up a fruit and vegetable stall with our harvest, to raise money for some new toys for our classroom... so watch this space!

DIAMOND CLASS

A lovely sunny week this week! The children have made a brilliant start to our new English unit based on *The Ever-Changing Earth*. We've had some genuinely impressive discussions about complex scientific ideas, and the children have shown real curiosity as they begin to explore how these concepts link to the text.

In Maths, we have begun one of the most challenging units of the year: time. The children have been using real clocks to practise telling the time to the nearest minute. This is a tricky skill that really benefits from regular practice at home, especially reading analogue clocks around the house.

In Science, we have continued our investigations into forces and magnets, looking at how these ideas appear in real-life situations. The children have enjoyed spotting examples in the classroom and around in everyday life, and they are beginning to apply scientific vocabulary with growing confidence.

A special mention must go to **Year 4**. I am extremely impressed with the effort many of you are putting into improving your times tables scores. With the Multiplication Tables Check coming up in June, it is vital that this level of focus continues. Daily practice on TTRS does really make a huge difference!

Finally, I have had to give a big reminder about homework expectations this week. Guided Reading work should be completed neatly, using joined up handwriting, accurate spellings (especially when taken directly from the book), and detailed ideas supported by conjunctions. MyMaths homework is also a concern at the moment, with a large number of outstanding tasks. Please ensure these overdue tasks are completed and each new task is completed each week — logins were re-sent last week.

SAPPHIRE CLASS Just like these bright and sunny days, it has been wonderful to see the children's smiles, readiness to learn and kind attitudes towards one another.

English – Writing - Inspired by *Jim and the Beanstalk* by Raymond Briggs, the children are exploring the story through prediction, storytelling and narrative development. We have recently been focusing on how to write dialogue, learning to use inverted commas (speech marks) accurately. Pupils are writing conversations between Jim and the Giant, developing their creativity and understanding of character voices.

How you can help at home: Encourage your child to retell the story or create their own version. You could ask them to predict what might happen next or support them in writing a short conversation between characters using speech marks.

Maths - We have just completed our work on position and direction in geometry. The children will be learning about fractions for the remainder of the half term, helping children understand parts of a whole in a practical and engaging way.

How you can help at home: - Look for opportunities to talk about position and direction in everyday life (e.g. left, right, forwards, backwards). You can also introduce simple fractions by sharing food (e.g. halves and quarters).

RE - Our focus remains on The Lord's Prayer, where children are exploring why Jesus taught this prayer and why it remains important to Christians today. Children are developing their understanding of how the prayer reflects key values such as trust, forgiveness, gratitude and making thoughtful choices. Through discussion, children are beginning to see how these ideas can influence the way people live and how they treat others, both within their communities and beyond.

How you can help at home: Talk with your child about kindness, forgiveness, and making thoughtful choices. You may also wish to read or reflect on a simple version of the Lord's Prayer together.

Please note: A letter has been sent out regarding our upcoming **RE visit to Forty Hall on 18th May**.

Science – Habitats and Microhabitats - Pupils are continuing their learning about habitats and microhabitats, exploring and investigating how plants and animals depend on their environment to survive.

How you can help at home: Go on a short walk or explore your garden to look for microhabitats (such as under logs, stones, or leaves). Talk about what you find and why those living things might choose to live there.

Online Safety Tip 7: Protect your passwords

It is important for children to understand how to keep their online accounts safe. Many pupils are using logins for games, apps, and school platforms, so learning how to create strong passwords — and keep them private — helps protect their information and keeps them safe online.

Why strong passwords matter:

- Keeps all accounts safe from being accessed by others
- Protects personal information
- Avoids problems in games such as items disappearing or accounts being taken over
- Builds good digital habits as they become more independent online
- Help to be a responsible digital citizen

A strong password is one of the simplest ways to stay safe online.

What makes a strong password?

A good password should be:

- Long - the longer it is, the harder it is to guess
- A passphrase - a short, memorable sentence (e.g., BlueElephantsRunFast)
- Unique - different for each app or game
- Private - never shared with friends
- Not personal - avoid names, pets, birthdays, school names, or football teams
- Hard to predict - no "1234", "password", or simple patterns

What to Look For

What to check	Why it matters	Tip
Weak or simple passwords	Easy for others to guess	Use a passphrase
Reusing the same password	If one account is accessed, others are at risk	Create different passphrases for different accounts
Sharing passwords with friends	Friends may access your account and cause issues	Remind children, 'Passwords are private'
No extra security	Accounts are easier to access	Turn on two-step verification where possible

Building Healthy Online Habits

- Create family password rules (e.g. adults keep a secure record)
- Talk about why we don't use names, pets or birthdays
- Check saved passwords together on devices
- Encourage children to use different passphrases for different apps
- Make password checks part of your regular routine

Miss Anderson's top tip: "Think of your password like your toothbrush — you don't share it, and you change it regularly."
