As we are about to enter our final few weeks at St. John's School, excitement is looming along with a mixture of emotions as we say goodbye to many members of our community. Of course, we will all be very sad to see our wonderful Year 6 pupils leaving us as they head off to pastures new, we wish them all the very best and have every confidence that they are very well prepared to embark on the new exciting challenges that lie ahead! We are also saying goodbye to many of our families that have been very loyal and supportive of St. John's School, to you we are so grateful, do keep in touch as we love to hear how our past pupils are doing.

I am delighted to report that there are no staff leaving us this year, and consequently there are no new appointments either which is a very positive position for St. John's School to be in. We are also celebrating a superb set of results across the school and are eagerly awaiting our SATs results which unfortunately have been delayed this year and are due on the 16 July. Once received, we will be reporting all this data on our school website for you to read at your leisure. Your child's school report will of course include the latest assessment data along with Learning plans that will be emailed to parents of SEND pupils by the end of term. Please note the new dates list for the Autumn Term, which is on page 8 of this newsletter.

Next week we will be running our extensive transition programme where all year groups will be placed in their classes that they will be in for September. I am really grateful for the time and commitment from all staff that goes into the organisation and management of this transition programme, not only before it starts but also throughout next week, where we will be making changes and adaptations in order to ensure that every class is ready for September. With this in mind, I have had to cancel the Collective Worship assemblies that we were due to run in the final week as staff will not have the time to prepare for these with the demands of this transition programme next week.

Our overall attendance so far this year is 94.5%, with two weeks left to go, we are urging every parent and pupil to make one big final effort to get this final attendance score as high as we can by the 17th July. Please ensure that your child is at the gate for 8.40am as once your child arrives in the classroom, early morning work will begin. Next year, there are no changes to the start time of Breakfast Club and After School Clubs will finish at 4pm Monday – Thursday. In order to ensure the safety of all pupils and parents at home time, we will continue the staggered dismissal times which are as follows:

Ruby Class @ 3pm, Sapphire Class @ 3.02pm, Diamond Class @ 3.05pm and Emerald Class @ 3.10pm

Throughout the summer as well, I can't emphasise enough the importance of continuing with reading and other activities that your child is interested in pursuing – it all really helps your child's overall development. Don't forget to visit the local Library where you can participate in their Reading Challenge – we will be presenting certificates to the pupils who have completed this in our first Celebration Assembly on the 4th September when parents will be welcome to join us.

Congratulations to Mrs Qayum who is attending her Graduation Ceremony as she has achieved qualified teacher status. Also congratulations to Ms. Dall'Aglia who has been awarded a BA Hons in Early Childhood Education (1st class honours). Excellent news for both members of staff who have worked so hard this year and thank you to Mrs Gatward, Ms Chebbi & Miss Kelleher for supporting them with this work.

Please take the time to look at the information that has been sent out on the many local activities that your child can engage in this summer including the activities that the church is running over the holiday period.

We look forward to welcoming you back on **Wednesday 2nd September at 8.40am, Breakfast Club will also be open at 8am. Please remember to book in advance and make sure that you are in credit with your payments. It is important to note on the dates list for the next academic year that we have an extra four days holiday over the October half-term so please ensure that you use these dates for holiday and not school time as this really impacts on pupils' learning and general development.**

Next week the After School Clubs for Autumn Term 2026 will be emailed to you. Please keep an eye out for these as it is first come first served. There maybe a couple of changes, so it is extremely important that you email with the name of your child, class, day of club and which club.

Absent Procedures

Please may we remind parents/carers of the following if your child is absent.

- Please telephone or email the school office on the morning your child is absent.
- On the return of your child's absence a letter with an explanation needs to be brought into school or you can email the school with the reasons.
- If your child is absent for more than 3 days then we do require medical evidence, otherwise this will be an unauthorised absence.

School Dinners

This is a reminder that Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 are all receiving & entitled to UIFSM (Universal Infant Free School Meals) & KS2 (Year 3, 4, 5 & 6) are receiving free school meals as the Mayor of London has given schools some funds towards this.

Nursery do have to pay for school dinners at £3.74, so please ensure that your ParentPay school dinner account is in credit.

Online Safety Tip 10: Healthy and Unhealthy Screen Use

Children use screens for lots of different things — learning, creativity, communication, and play — and every family manages this in their own way. In school, we focus on helping children develop healthy, balanced screen habits and teaching them how to use digital tools safely and confidently. Understanding how digital tools support learning helps families feel informed and reassured about how technology can be used at home.

Why healthy screen use matters:

- Supports children's wellbeing and sleep
- Helps them focus better at school
- Encourages positive online behaviour
- Teaches independence and self-regulation
- Ensures devices are used for both learning and fun

Balanced screen use helps children stay safe, healthy, and ready to learn.

Why digital tools support learning:

Digital tools are not used to "add more screen time" — they are used because they enhance learning, support different needs, and prepare children for the world they are growing up in.

- Strengthening memory and understanding — Interactive tasks, videos, and animations help children understand tricky concepts and remember them more easily.
- Supporting different learning needs — Tools like text-to-speech, voice typing, adjustable fonts, and visual models help children with SEND or learning barriers access the curriculum.
- Building independence and problem-solving — Children learn to search safely, evaluate information, organise their work, and edit their ideas.
- Developing digital literacy — Just as we teach reading and writing, we teach children how to navigate the digital world safely and confidently.
- Increasing motivation and engagement — Interactive challenges, instant feedback, and creative tools help children stay focused and enjoy learning.

Healthy screen use should be purposeful, supervised, and balanced with offline activities.

Building Healthy Online Habits

- Talk about how screens make children feel — excited, tired, frustrated, calm
- Encourage a balance of activities: outdoor play, reading, hobbies, and screens
- Model healthy screen use as adults
- Support children to use digital tools for learning as well as entertainment
- Make screen-use check-ins part of your regular routine
