Dear Friends of BOHCM

It is always a pleasure to send you our latest Newsletter which gives an insight into the many lives you are transforming in Uganda. We sincerely appreciate all you do in Jesus name, both practically and prayerfully.



Vocational Graduates

This year another sixteen young people who have been part of our child sponsorship scheme successfully completed their Vocational Training in their chosen skill. We were delighted to be able to provide each of them with a *Small Business Start-Up Package*. Ben, the manager of BOHCM, reported that the event was very colourful and well attended by families and Care Givers. The equipment presented to students included sewing machines, carpentry & building tools, hair dressing essentials and craft materials. All these young graduates are now trained in a skill to work and be financially independent.

Currently we have another nineteen students

undertaking a range of courses and we pray that in 2027 we will be celebrating their success.

Children's Village (CV)

Over the past years it has become increasingly more difficult to provide enough water for the CV and the BOH School. During the prolonged dry season our rain water harvesters frequently run dry

and finding another water source is time consuming and uncertain. However, we are now pleased to confirm that the National Water & Sewage Corporation (NWSC) have completed the installation of the piped water to the CV and School. This has greatly reduced the pressure on the need to locate and transport water to both sites.

Peace, one of our teenagers who lives at the CV, started a Tailoring Course in February this year at the Mothers Union Training Centre for girls. We are all so very proud of Peace, although she struggled with academic work in school, she has excelled in her chosen Vocational Course.

Furthermore she presented the young children at the CV with clothes and bags that she had made for them.

It is really encouraging to know that our flexible approach to educating children is providing them with the right opportunities and support.



Child Sponsorship

We currently have 129 children on our sponsorship scheme and all those of school age are attending either Nursery, Primary, Secondary School or Vocational Training.

Although we have many encouraging stories to share, we also at times receive some very, very sad news. Recently we heard from our manager that Unique, a boy with special needs, had died. During the funeral service BOHCM and Unique's sponsor were thanked for all the support given to this young boy and his family over the past six years. Unique will always be remembered for his lovely smile and friendly character and we are so glad that BOHCM was able to make his young life more enjoyable and comfortable.

Bridge of Hope Nursery and Primary School

We are very excited to confirm that plans are in place to construct a much needed school hall. This will not only enable the teachers and children to hold assemblies together and meet with parents, but also the Primary 7 leaving exams will then take place on site, fully completing the Education Department's requirements as an approved Exam Sitting Centre. We aim to commence construction early February 2027.

T-Shirt Appeal

A very BIG thank you to everyone who provided T-Shirts for the children. We now have a full luggage allowance and aim to take them to Uganda in 2027. The children will be so happy to receive these gifts.

Community Projects

A kitchen has been constructed for an elderly grandmother and the children in her care, giving her a safe place to cook meals throughout the year. Plans are now in place to construct two more kitchens this year. Two other families received a much needed latrine, providing them with the dignity that we all require whilst also enabling them to improve their health and overall wellbeing.

Exploring Faith, Values and Community Through Religious Education

We are exploring **where faith meets life**: how beliefs shape the way people live, make choices and respond to life's important moments. Across our RE learning, we are reflecting on how faith is lived out through **actions, relationships and community**, while recognising that different beliefs and experiences can help us learn from and respect one another.

Sapphire Class

What are some of the important events in a Christian's life?

Sapphire Class will be exploring important events in a Christian's life, including: Baptism - Marriage - Confirmation - Funerals. Children will learn why these events are significant and how Christians celebrate, remember and come together as a community during important moments in life.

Pupils will also compare Christian celebrations with special events in their own lives and consider what makes an event meaningful.

Diamond Class

How did belief in God affect the actions of people from the Old Testament?

Diamond Class will be exploring the lives and stories of **Abraham, Noah, Moses and David**.

Children will consider how their belief in God influenced their decisions and encouraged them to demonstrate: Faith - Courage - Trust - Obedience. Children will reflect on the question: "How can our beliefs influence the choices we make?" They will also consider how values such as kindness, courage and honesty can influence their own actions.

Emerald Class

What might the journey of life and death look like from a Christian perspective?

Emerald Class will explore the journey of life, considering how Christians understand: Birth - Growing up - Relation Children will learn about Christian beliefs surrounding the seven sacraments.

This learning will encourage thoughtful reflection on the importance of love, memories, relationships and hope.

Community Reflection

How can our beliefs influence the choices we make?

How do communities support one another during important moments in life?

What gives people hope when life is difficult?

How can we show kindness and respect towards people with different beliefs?

Help us to have faith when we face challenges, courage when we need to make difficult choices, and kindness towards those around us.
