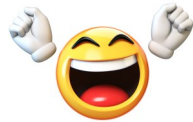

## DIAMOND CLASS

Week 1 of transition completed, it is crazy to think we are at this time of the year already! We started the week setting some targets for next year, it is always good to hear what the children think they should be working on. Lots of targets involve handwriting and times tables which are easy ones to work on at home over the summer!

We started work on a new writing text called the Matchbox Diary where the children have come up with some great predictions about the items in the box. In maths, we started to look at place value a fundamental knowledge of number which is the building block for other mathematical skills. We have started guided reading groups in transition also, children have the opportunity to read in a group with other children and read some fascinating texts. These groups are not permanent, and I will assess the children throughout the year and children can move groups if necessary. Please make sure that you continue to be present whilst your child is reading; regularly asking questions to check for their understanding.

In the afternoons we have carried out some touch typing which the children really enjoy. There are many free options online that can really help children's skills, speed and accuracy. It can even help improve children's spelling awareness too!

Today we have spoken about how our bodies change as we get older. If your child has any questions, please remind them that I am available to discuss anything and they can leave an anonymous question in the box within our classroom which I can address when appropriate.

## EMERALD CLASS

An extremely encouraging 4-day week in Emerald class with our new year 5 children visiting each morning and settling in very well to the routines.

In English we have been focusing on the book Robot Girl by Malorie Blackman and had an interesting conversation on whether or not they would prefer a robot/AI teacher, they were certainly honest!!

In maths we have been focusing on multiplication as I wanted to ensure all of the children were competent using the recommended multiplication calculation strategies. I was pleasantly surprised by their understanding, although I would say that even though the year 4 children have completed their multiplication tables check test it is essential they are still learning and revising their timestables.

During the afternoons, back with the current year 5/6 children, we looked at the different tribes in the rainforest and the similarities and differences between our lifestyle and theirs. It was fascinating to realise how many isolated tribes still survived in the rainforest despite all the climate change issues and deforestation. Mrs Gatward and myself were also extremely pleased with the mature attitudes the children displayed when participating in one of our relationships and sex education lessons yesterday afternoon, I hope they came home and maybe discussed some of the things we were talking about.

We hope you all have a relaxing and enjoyable weekend and hopefully the sun will shine.

# Summer is here!

## Keep your children Safe in the Sun.



**Apply sunscreen** (minimum, SPF30 or SPF50 with at least 4\* UVA protection rating) at least 30 minutes before your child goes outside. Re-apply every 2 hours, and after swimming, even if it states that the sunscreen is water resistant. Pay particular attention so that hands, feet, cheeks, nose, ears, shoulders and back of the neck are covered. Do check that the sunscreen is not past its expiry date.



**Wear** loose, long sleeve clothing.



**Wear** a wide brimmed hat.



**Wear** sunglasses with adequate UV protection (look for the CE or UKCA mark).



**Find** shady areas to play, especially between 11am-3pm.



**Keep** hydrated and drink plenty of water.



**Keep** babies under 6 months of age out of direct sunlight.
